Introduction

In today's competitive digital landscape, leveraging AI to enhance your workflows has become essential for survival. Organizations that fail to incorporate generative AI into their content strategies risk falling behind competitors and rapidly decreasing visibility on SERPs and AI search.

While AI writing assistants offer tremendous potential to boost team productivity, accelerate content creation, and increase visibility in both traditional and AI-powered search engines, simply adopting any AI technology isn't enough to gain a competitive edge. The reality is that AI content generation success depends on one critical factor: the quality of your AI writing assistant.

The best AI writing assistant is one that aligns with your specific content needs, enhances your existing processes, and consistently delivers high-quality output that doesn't require significant edits or rewrites. But with countless options flooding the market, how do you identify which solution will actually deliver value?

This in-depth evaluation report examines four leading AI writing assistants—Jasper AI, Semrush, Writer AI, and our own Conductor Writing Assistant—to help you make an informed decision based on objective criteria rather than marketing hype.

Evaluation methodology

Let's be clear. If you want to choose the right AI writing assistant, you need to evaluate more than just the quality of the writing the AI generates.

Things like subject-verb agreement, grammar, and reading level are important considerations, but these AI tools have such deep capabilities that writing quality is only one piece of the puzzle.

You need to look more holistically at each AI output to see how it performs beyond simple text generation. While AI can help your productivity, it can also expose your brand to significant security, brand authority, and technical health risks.

That's why we put together the following rubric to grade each AI output, based on our strategic AI evaluation framework. Take a look at the rubric we used, and check out the Output Index at the end of this report to evaluate the output for yourselves.

AI writing assistant evaluation rubric

Below is a breakdown of the evaluation criteria we used to grade each AI output, as well as the questions we asked ourselves as we graded the content.

Data

This category evaluates each AI output based on the quality of the model's training data.

Output specificity: Does the output include generic and basic, accurate information broadly available on Google and social media?

Data freshness: How recent is the data being used to generate my content?

Technical health

This category evaluates each AI output based on whether it meets SEO requirements.

Security

This category evaluates each AI output based on the safeguards that prevent data leakage, hallucinations, plagiarism, and other risks that could damage your brand reputation

Hallucinations: Does the output include incorrect or fabricated information or statistics?

Plagiarism: Does the output contain basic or generic language that could have been pulled word-for-word from existing sources?

Expertise

This category evaluates each AI output based on whether the model is generating sophisticated content or generic output.

Domain expertise: Does the AI output leverage specific expertise in creating high-quality website content that performs well in organic search?

Content score: Does the AI evaluate the quality of its output on its own?

In terms of grading, we assign each AI writing assistant a score of 1-5 for each category. For any categories with subcategories, we'll take the average of their scores for that category's overall score. In addition, some criteria may be more important than others depending on your organizational priorities, so we've weighted the scores accordingly. Below is a breakdown of the scores as well as a brief description of what they mean.

Keep in mind that regardless of which AI writing assistant you choose, you'll always need to leverage human expertise in order to edit and get the content ready for publishing. The goal here isn't to find content that is 100% ready to publish out of the AI, the goal is to find output that will actually streamline your workflows and optimize visibility.



Evaluating AI writing assistant output

Now that we have established our methodology, let's get into the results.

We used the same topic and prompt across all four AI writing assistants, and didn't provide any additional notes, outlines, style reports, or context that could have given any tool a leg up. All of the outputs were generated on May 2, 2025, and are based on the topic 2025 NBA Playoffs Update. Since more NBA playoff games have taken place since we initiated this report, it reflects the findings up until that date.

With that bit of housekeeping in order, let's dive deeper into each rubric category and the grade each output earned based on how well it answers each core question.

Data

If you read our [Strategic Buyer's Guide to AI Writing Assistants](#), you know that data is a central pillar of AI evaluation. Essentially, this category evaluates the quality of the model's training data. But since this can impact more than just the AI output, we'll limit this category to a few critical considerations.

Specifically, you should ask yourself the following data-centric questions for every AI output.

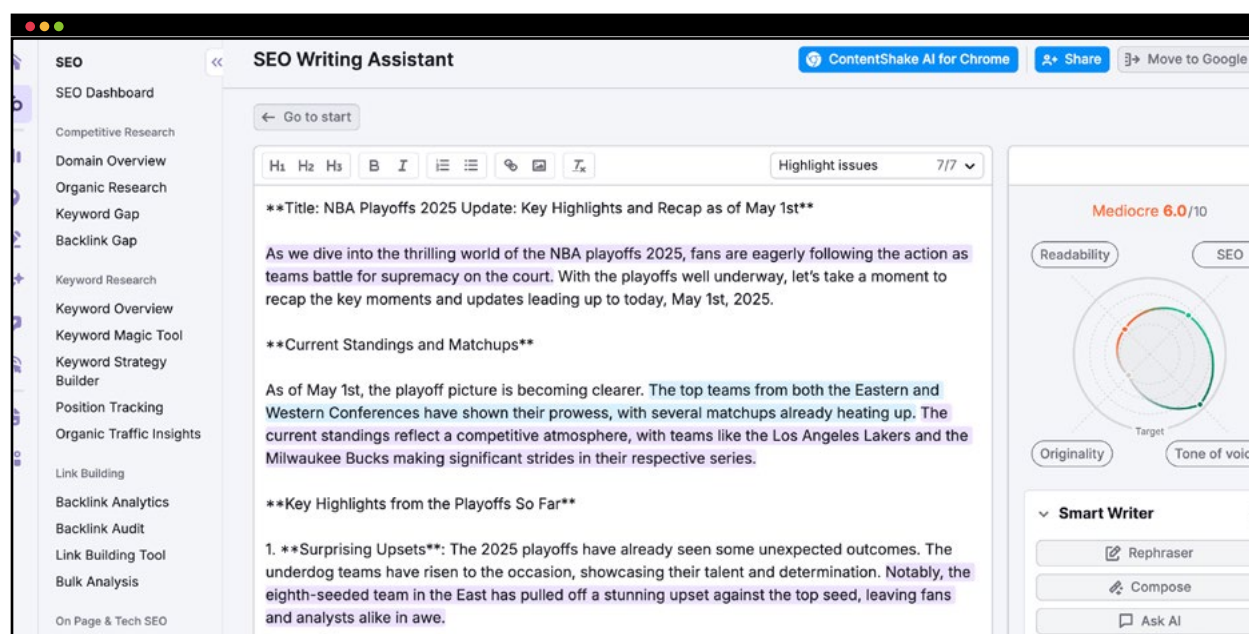
- **Output specificity:** Does the output include generic and basic information you could have gotten from a simple Google search?
- **Data freshness:** How recent is the data being used to generate my content?

Check out our evaluations of output performance on these data elements.

Semrush

This is a screenshot of Semrush's AI output on the 2025 NBA playoffs.

Reminder: The full-length version of each output is in the index at the end of this report. We will provide screenshots of relevant sections when assigning rankings.



Output specificity ②

Does the output include generic and basic, accurate information broadly available on Google and social media?

In terms of data, Semrush leaves a lot to be desired. In terms of specificity, it provided some information that a **Google search could have done much better**. Specifically, in the “Current Standings and Matchups” section, it didn’t even provide the names of the top teams in each conference, instead just calling them: “top teams from both the Eastern and Western Conferences.” A quick Google search would have instantly turned up that the top teams in each conference were the Cleveland Cavaliers and Oklahoma City Thunder.

In short, you could have found this or better information from a Google search.

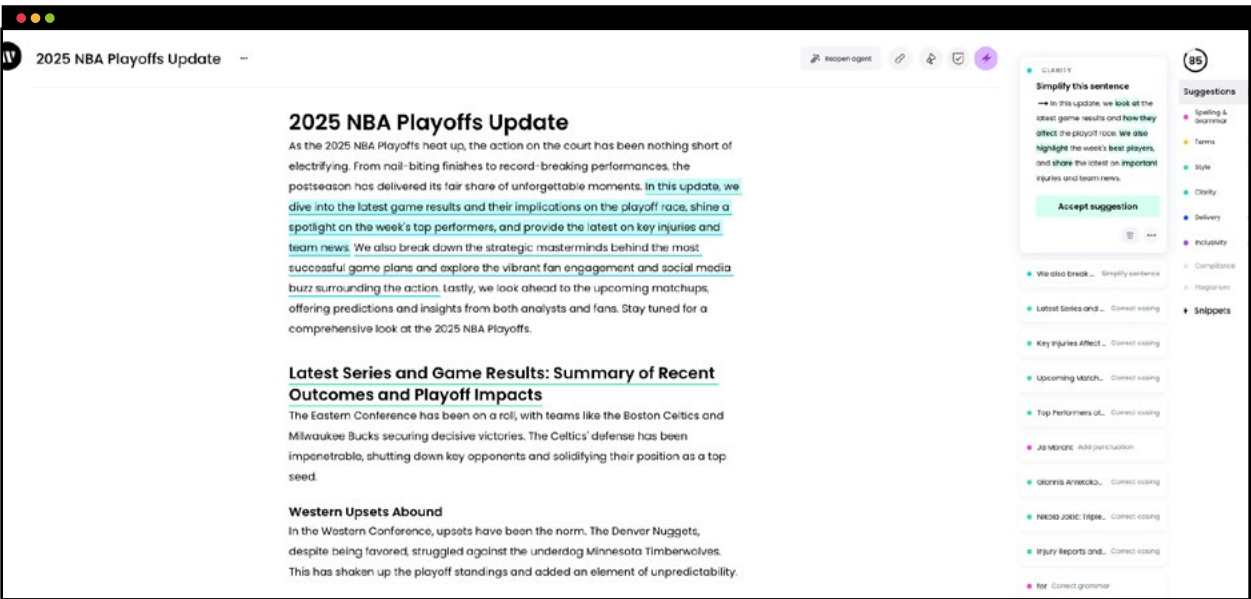
Data freshness ②

How recent is the data being used to generate my content?

As for data freshness, it’s difficult to tell exactly when Semrush’s data is from. It says that the information is accurate as of May 2, 2025, but it has **some inaccuracies that make it less clear when this information was pulled**. For example, it highlights the Los Angeles Lakers and Milwaukee Bucks as performing well in their respective series; however, as of May 2, both the Lakers **and** Bucks had been eliminated from playoff contention.

Writer AI

Next up is Writer AI. Again, we covered the same topic with Writer, asking it to provide an update on the NBA Playoffs up to May 2, 2025.



Output specificity ①

Does the output include generic and basic, accurate information broadly available on Google and social media?

As you can see, Writer’s **output is a bit more specific than Semrush’s**; it calls out more teams by name than Semrush did, and even discusses key aspects of team performance, like the “Celtics’ impenetrable defense.” That said, is any of this information a clear upgrade over what you could find through Google? Tough to say that it is, since Google would actually provide correct information.

Data freshness ①

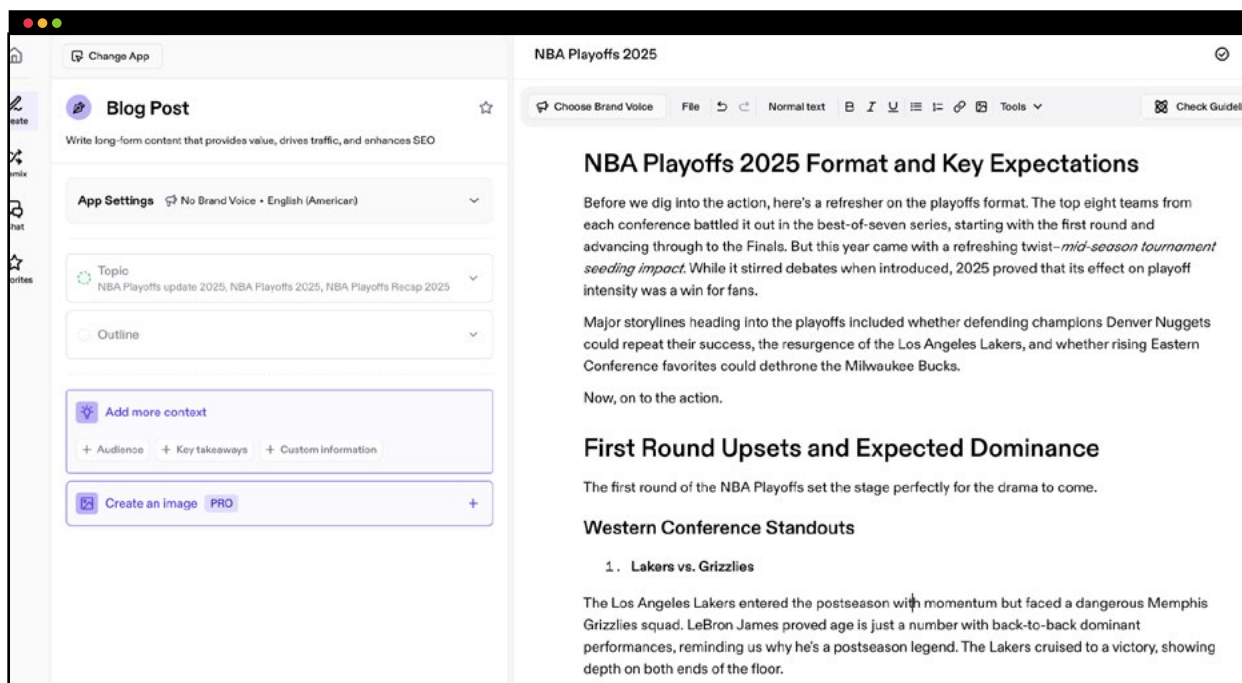
How recent is the data being used to generate my content?

As of May 2, 2025, five out of the eight opening matchups in the NBA playoffs had been decided, with another matchup being decided that night. Despite that, Writer doesn’t provide much beyond surface-level information about a few teams that are particularly popular or played exceptionally well over the last few years. It didn’t necessarily provide the most helpful or relevant information.

In addition, it once again brings up the Milwaukee Bucks as securing a decisive victory, but as we already covered, they did not. The Bucks were eliminated in five games in what was largely viewed as a disappointing showing. That’s a **glaring inaccuracy and calls into question the data** that Writer pulled from to generate this output.

Jasper AI

Next up, we have Jasper AI. Here's a quick peek at what their AI provided for an NBA playoffs update.



Output specificity ①

Does the output include generic and basic, accurate information broadly available on Google and social media?

Once again, this is a bit more specific than Writer's output was, as it provides clear matchups, as well as establishing a few of the biggest names to watch in each series. In terms of specificity, that's pretty good, as it was also able to match key players to their correct teams, like LeBron James and the Lakers, and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander of the Thunder.

That said, despite having **some specificity, it also includes multiple inaccuracies**. For instance, the Lakers *didn't play* the Grizzlies in this year's playoffs. The opening also wonders whether an Eastern Conference team can dethrone the Milwaukee Bucks, but the Bucks haven't won the Championships or even made it to the Finals since 2021. So again, this isn't a clear upgrade over a Google search.

Maybe most egregiously, later on in the piece, they mention the Philadelphia 76ers playing the Celtics despite the 76ers having completely *missed* the playoffs.

Data freshness ①

How recent is the data being used to generate my content?

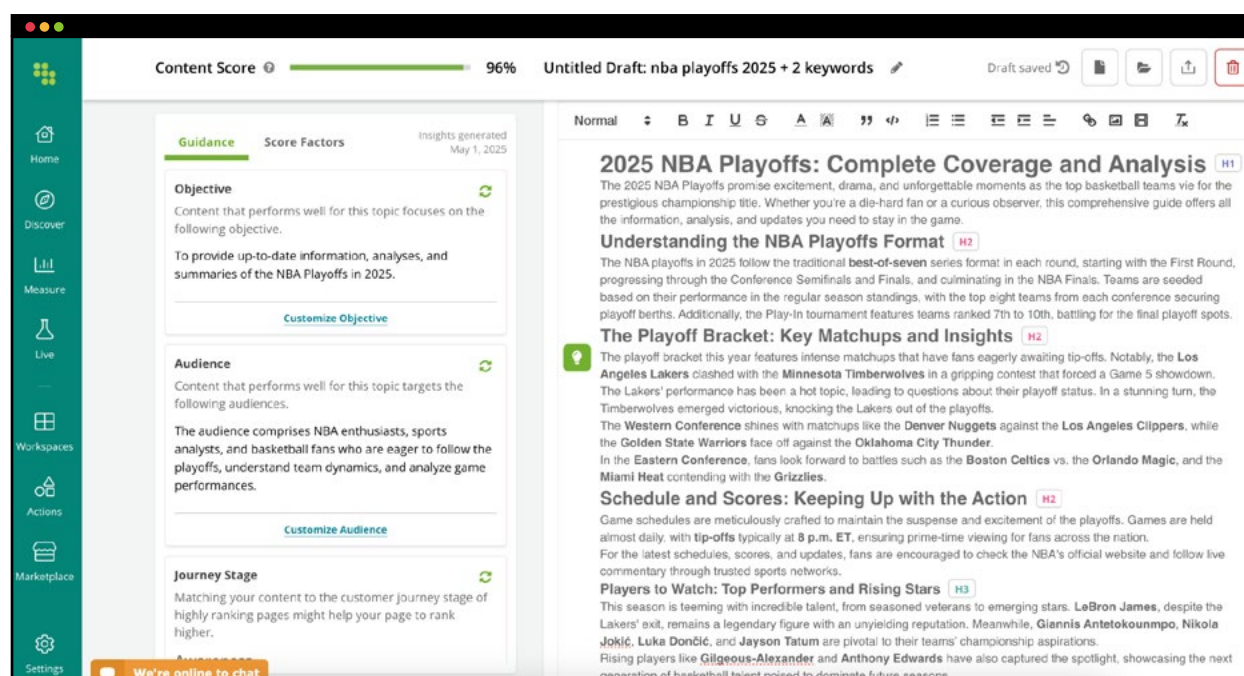
There are **several inaccuracies and hallucinations** that call the data foundation for this output into question. While it did correctly state that the Memphis Grizzlies were the No. 8 seed, the output is wrong about them playing the top-seeded Lakers. The Lakers were a No. 3 seed and did not play against Memphis this postseason.

In addition, none of these matchups had taken place as of May 2, despite Jasper claiming that they're complete. While the Thunder and Nuggets did play one another, the series wouldn't begin until May 5.

Finally, Jasper refers to the Denver Nuggets as the defending champions, but they won the title in 2023, with the Boston Celtics being this year's defending champions.

Conductor

Finally, we have the output from Conductor's Writing Assistant.



Output specificity ③

Does the output include generic and basic, accurate information broadly available on Google and social media?

The output from Conductor starts off pretty strong, diving into not only the specifics of how the NBA playoffs work, just like Jasper's did, but also some of the most exciting matchups so far. The breakdown of the Minnesota Timberwolves and Los Angeles Lakers series is particularly solid, correctly stating the result of the series and how many games it took. This output also populates questions that are related to the playoffs as a whole, **anticipating some questions that NBA fans or casual observers might have**.

While that's an improvement over some of the other outputs, Conductor's output has its faults, too. In particular, it mentions two matchups that didn't occur in this year's playoffs. The Thunder and Warriors haven't played in the postseason this year, and neither have the Heat and Grizzlies—in fact, the Grizzlies play in the Western Conference, despite Conductor listing them in the East. Due to those inaccuracies, a Google search may have been more helpful in this case.

Data freshness ④

How recent is the data being used to generate my content?

On one hand, some of the data is very recent. This copy was pulled on May 2, 2025, and it already accounts for the Timberwolves beating the Lakers in 5 games, a series that ended on April 30. It even reinforces the point by stating: "LeBron James, despite the Lakers' exit, remains a legendary figure with an unyielding reputation." It also correctly calls out the matchups between the Nuggets and Clippers, and the Celtics and Magic.

But it also **suffers from a few hallucinations and shows outdated information** in places. For one, it mentions Luka Dončić as being pivotal to his team's championship aspirations, but he plays on the Lakers, which the output had already correctly said were eliminated. That, coupled with the incorrect matchups it generated between the Heat and Grizzlies and the Warriors and Thunder, makes it unclear how recent all of the data used in this output was.

Final Score: Data

Overall, each of the outputs had various inaccuracies, hallucinations, and outdated information. That means they'll all need editing and oversight from a human to ensure overall quality. That said, some of them definitely require more work than the others to get to a state where they're ready to publish.

While Semrush and Conductor have the fewest hallucinations and inaccuracies, Semrush's was also the shortest and least specific, actually using placeholders for player and team names rather than pulling fresh data.

Meanwhile, Jasper AI and Writer AI were both rife with inaccuracies and hallucinations. The Jasper output even went so far as to crown an NBA champion for 2025, despite the fact that, at the time of generation, the Finals were still weeks away—it said the Lakers would play the Bucks, in that Finals game when both teams had already been eliminated.

Data output winner: Conductor

Conductor's output stood out because it struck the best balance of specificity and accuracy. All of the outputs had hallucinations, but Conductor exhibited the freshest data and most unique content.

Expertise

The next evaluation pillar is expertise, which helps distinguish sophisticated AI-generated content from generic AI output. Content expertise and [Google's E-E-A-T framework](#) have huge benefits for your brand as a whole. If you can establish your brand as an authority on a given topic, you're more likely to appear on SERPs and in AI search.

When it comes to AI, we're evaluating their expertise based on the following factors:

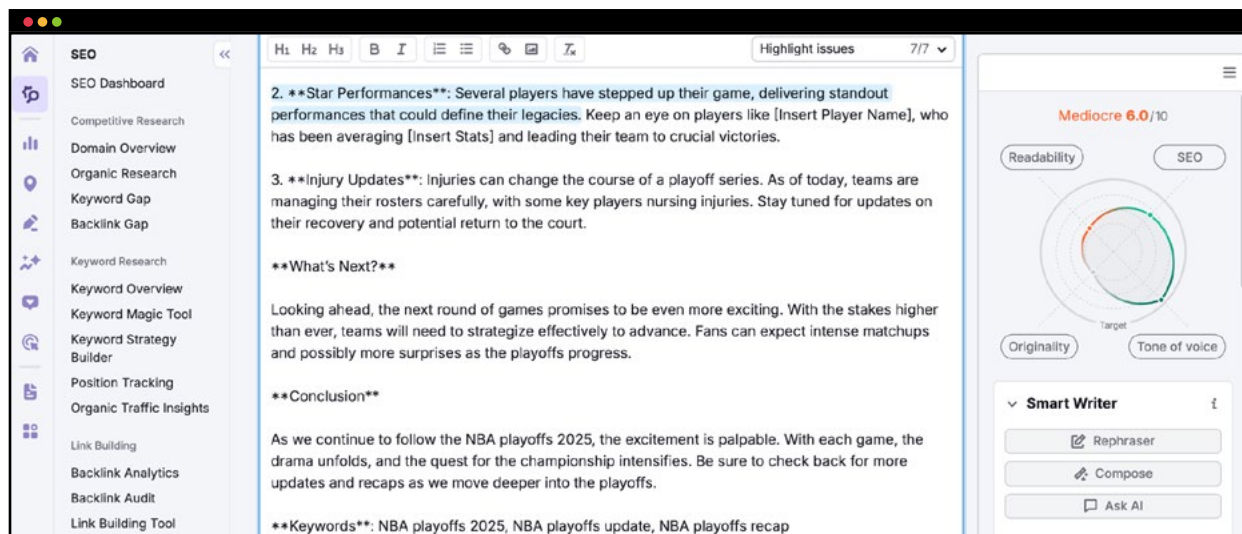
- **Domain expertise:** Does the AI output leverage specific expertise in creating high-quality website content that performs well in organic search?
- **Content score:** Does the AI evaluate the quality of its output on its own?

Along with the specific questions we'll explore for each output, remember to ask yourself throughout this process: Does this sound like an expert wrote it?

Our goal with this category is to see if the output can speak with authority and expertise on a given topic, provide well-structured, factual information, and provide feedback on its own work to optimize efficiently. After all, that's the kind of content that performs well in traditional and AI search.

Semrush

Let's take another look at Semrush's output with a focus on expertise.



Domain expertise ①

Does the AI output leverage specific expertise in creating high-quality website content that performs well in organic search?

If your friend asked you for an update on the NBA playoffs, would you send them a link to this article?

Semrush's output **doesn't sound like an expert wrote it**. Beyond the few inaccuracies we mentioned, it also lacks overall specificity and reads more like a template or content brief than an actual finished article that's ready to publish. Even in the "What's Next?" section, it doesn't mention what round of the playoffs is currently taking place, or what round is next. It just says that whatever the games are, they'll be exciting.

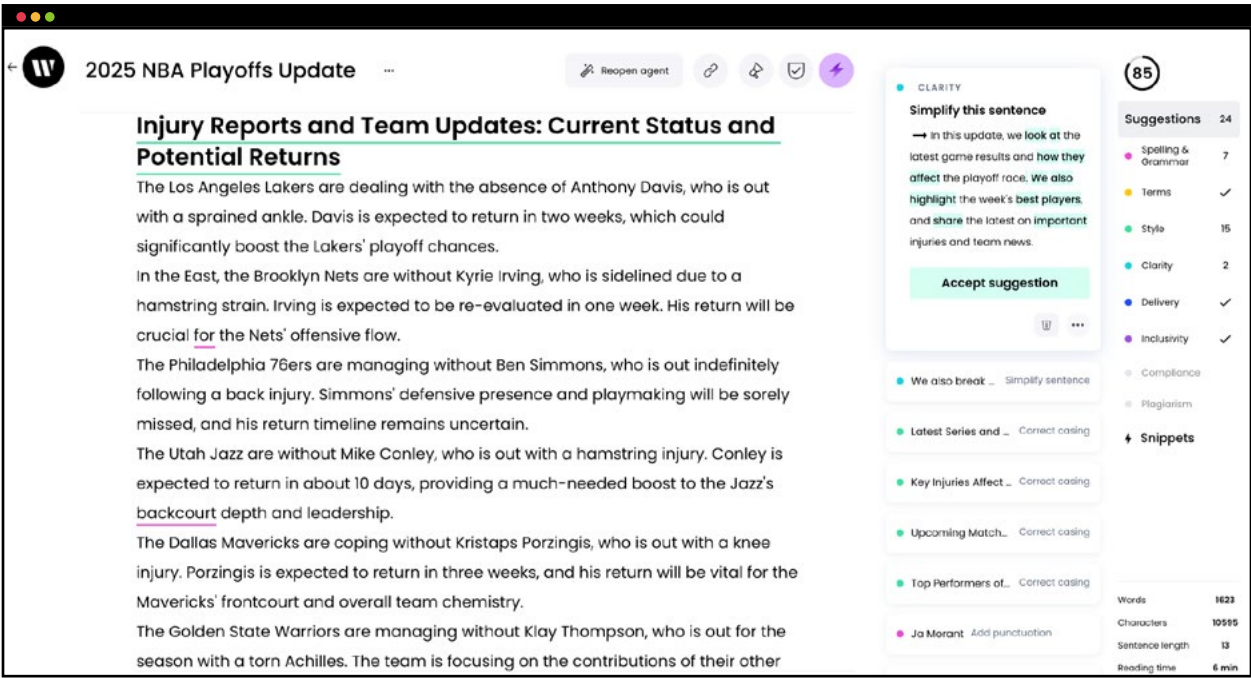
Content score ④

Does the AI evaluate the quality of its output on its own?

To its credit, Semrush **understands that this output still needs some work**. It graded the output as mediocre, which may still be generous, but it understands that you'll need to make significant edits to make sure that the work sounds more original and readable.

Writer AI

Let’s test Writer AI’s basketball expertise.



Domain expertise ②

Does the AI output leverage specific expertise in creating high-quality website content that performs well in organic search?

Writer AI sounds like they may have been a basketball expert about 4 or 5 years ago. Looking specifically at this section about recent player injuries shows **glaring inaccuracies and hallucinations**.

For starters, none of the injured players listed were injured or even played for those teams at the time of writing. The output may be right about the playoffs from a few years ago, but not 2025. That lack of fresh data we noticed came back to bite them on the expertise criteria, making the output sound dated and behind the times.

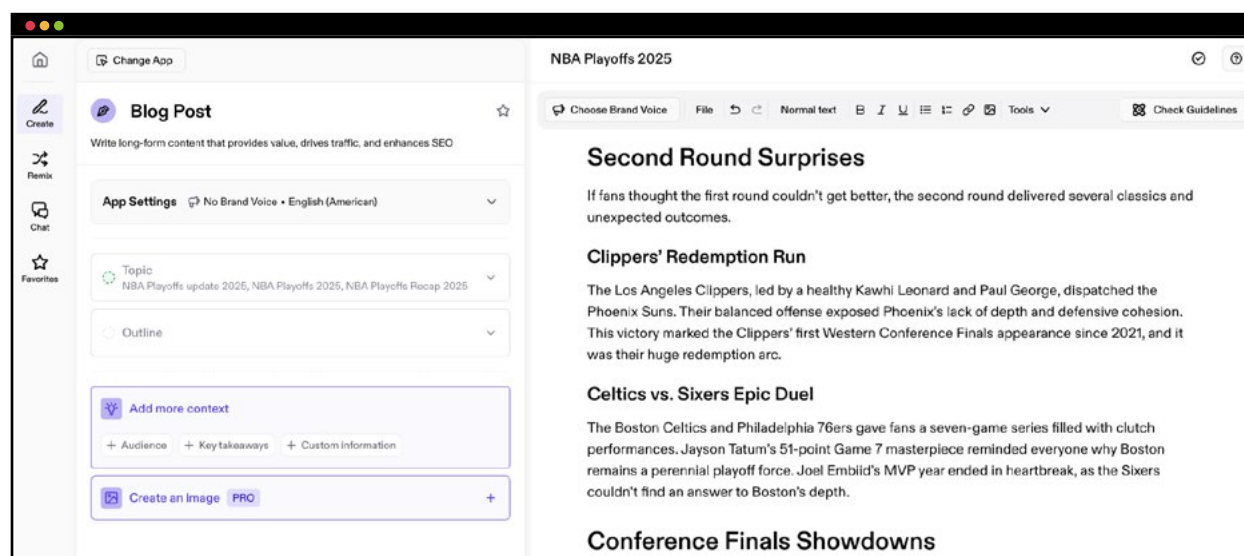
Content score ③

Does the AI evaluate the quality of its output on its own?

Oh, to have the confidence of Writer AI. Despite us finding a **myriad of holes in their output**, the tool is convinced it’s doing quite well with a self-rated 85 out of 100 content score. But you can see the entire output for yourselves. Does this look like material that’s an 85 out of 100? By our own scoring metrics used in this report, that would mean that the output is strong and requires very few manual edits and optimizations before publishing.

So while this AI can grade its output and offer feedback, the feedback is more like what you’d find in Grammarly’s UI, and the score itself is pretty generous given the issues we noticed.

Jasper AI



Domain expertise ②

Does the AI output leverage specific expertise in creating high-quality website content that performs well in organic search?

Like Writer AI's output, **Jasper's feels a bit behind the times.** It references Paul George, who no longer plays for the Clippers, though he did as recently as last season.

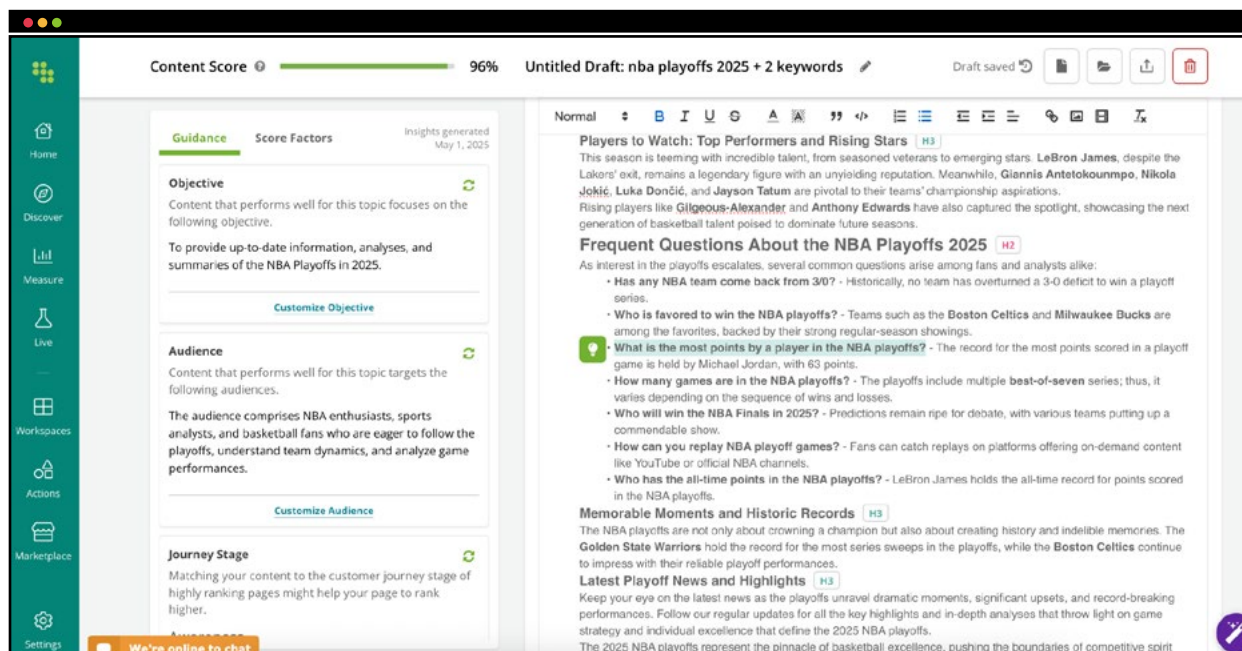
It also references the 76ers, just like Writer AI did, despite the 76ers missing the playoffs this season. They made the playoffs last year and last played the Celtics in the playoffs in 2023. So this output also feels like it lacks the more recent, nuanced expertise that would help content stand out in search.

Content score ①

Does the AI evaluate the quality of its output on its own?

By its own admission, Jasper: **"...can't directly grade or score your content**, but I can help analyze and improve it!" So while it can help you identify opportunities to optimize the content it generates, it can't provide a score like the other writing assistants can.

Conductor



Domain expertise ④

Does the AI output leverage specific expertise in creating high-quality website content that performs well in organic search?

Conductor and Semrush, again, produced the work with the fewest inconsistencies and outright factual errors. While their outputs were both shorter than those of Writer AI and Jasper AI, it's not exactly helpful if the extra information included wasn't accurate. Unlike Semrush, though, Conductor provides more specifics about these playoffs, as well as extra information about the playoffs historically.

Conductor's output tries to anticipate user needs to better satisfy their search intent by addressing People Also Ask questions. That's really what expertise is all about. **Take a look at the information that's unique to Conductor's output.**

- References the play-in tournament, a nuance to the seeding structure of the NBA playoffs.
- Establishes that the Lakers have been eliminated from the playoffs.

- Explains what times games generally start, anticipating that folks searching for an NBA playoffs update would want to watch the games in real-time.
- Dives into some important history and other frequently asked questions that the target audience may be interested in.

While Conductor's output does suffer from hallucinations and has its share of incorrect statements, generally speaking, the output does a better job of anticipating user needs and satisfying search intent than the others.

Content score ③

Does the AI evaluate the quality of its output on its own?

That said, Conductor's output was not perfect. Despite that, Conductor's Writing Assistant gave the content a score of 96 out of 100 based on keyword use and sentence structure. While the Conductor output was solid, a 96 is a little high, and **this content will need more work before it can be published.**

Final Score: Expertise

Consider each one of the outputs based on whether you would publish them on your website. Without some level of revision, you're probably not going to publish any of these as is on your website. That's a recipe for poor domain expertise.

But when it comes to the Writer AI and Jasper AI outputs, you're likely going to need to rewrite almost the entire article in order to eliminate the hallucinations and add in the correct information. It gives you a fairly well-structured article template to work from, but even those can feel incomplete, overlooking related topics that users might also be looking for.

Semrush, on the other hand, doesn't provide much information that you'll need to change, but their article is bare bones and feels incomplete, meaning you'll need to do the lion's share of the work building out and writing the remaining content.

Lastly, Conductor provides unique information that not only distinguishes itself from the competition but also anticipates users' needs and questions better than the others. It's true that Writer and Jasper have more detailed structures with sections dedicated to social media buzz, injuries, and specific series, and there is an opportunity to make the Conductor output stronger by including some of those sections; we'll just need to remove the hallucinations from them first.

Data output winner: Conductor

While Conductor was too generous with its content score, its output better satisfied audience search intent, anticipating their needs with people also ask questions and more accurate information.

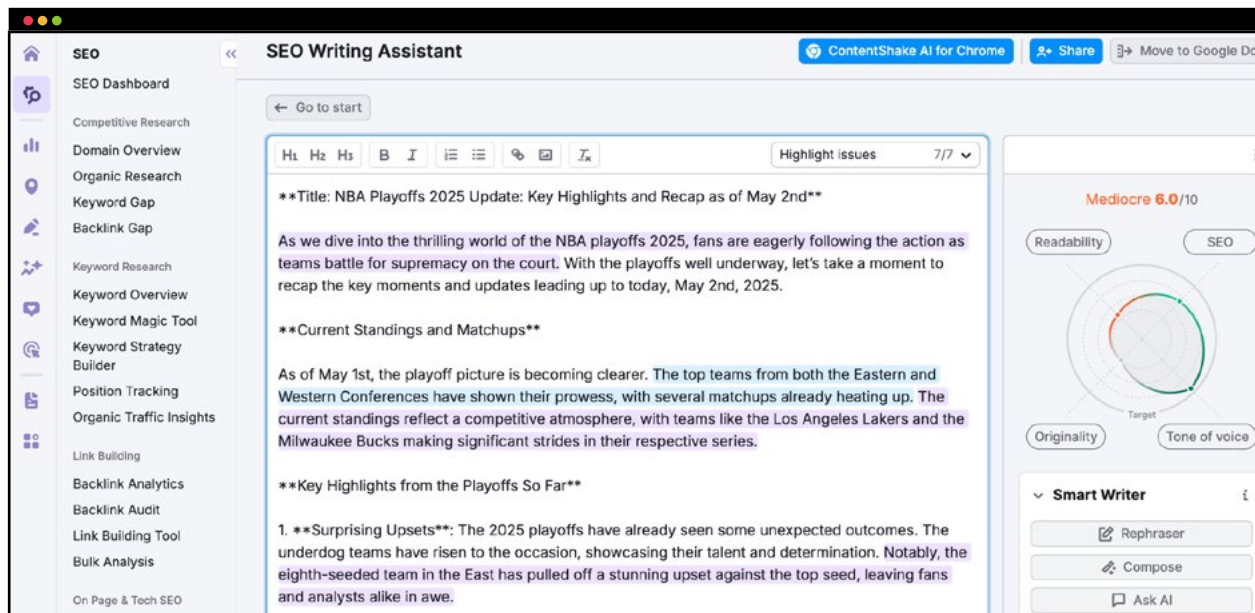
Technical health

Think of this as our [on-page SEO category](#). In it, we're evaluating how well each AI output aligns with SEO best practices from a heading and structure perspective, as well as on the metadata front with title tags and meta descriptions.

Generally, Google will cut off title tags and meta description text after 65 and 160 characters, respectively, so we'll keep this in mind, too, as we look into the SEO qualities of each output. The central question for this category is:

- **Technical health:** Does this output align with SEO best practices?

Semrush



From a structural perspective, the Semrush output is logical. It makes sense to go from the current playoff matchups to the key highlights so far. That said, the **output itself is very short and leaves out a lot of other information** that it could dive into about the playoffs, like injury updates, standout player performances, or even a section on where and how to stream games online.

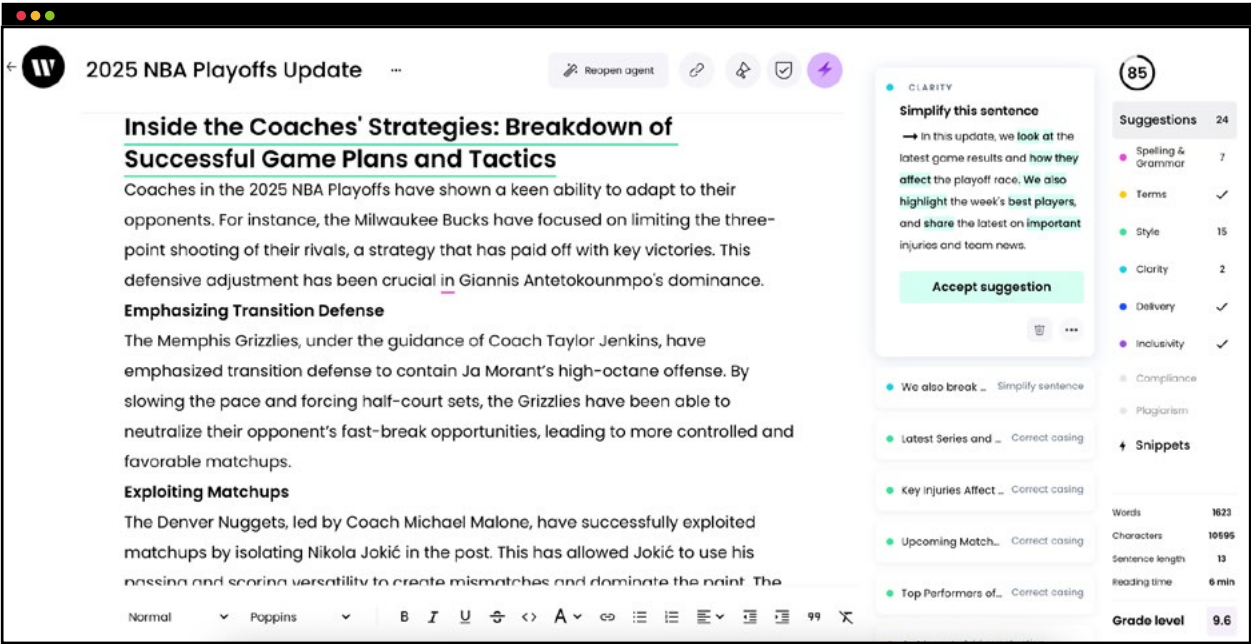
As for other SEO considerations, these are the title tag and meta descriptions that Semrush suggested:

Title: NBA Playoffs 2025 Update: Key Highlights and Recap as of May 2nd

Meta description: Stay updated with the latest NBA playoffs 2025 highlights and recaps as of May 2nd. Discover key matchups, surprising upsets, and star performances in this thrilling postseason. Don't miss out on the action!

While the meta description is a bit long, the title is a solid length and makes it clear that this is an article that will likely be updated as the playoffs continue to unfold. The title isn't perfect, as the recap of the playoffs is likely more important to users than the key highlights, but it gives a solid enough foundation to work off of.

Writer AI



Writer AI is more structurally sound than Semrush’s output. It explores a wide range of topics surrounding the NBA playoffs and generally has the most important or relevant information, like series and team updates, near the top of the page, with less important information, like coaching strategies, falling down below.

However, while the H2s are a bit long, they do make it clear what each section will be about. That said, the H3s don’t always state what the next section will cover, making it more difficult to skim through.

This is the metadata copy that Writer suggested:

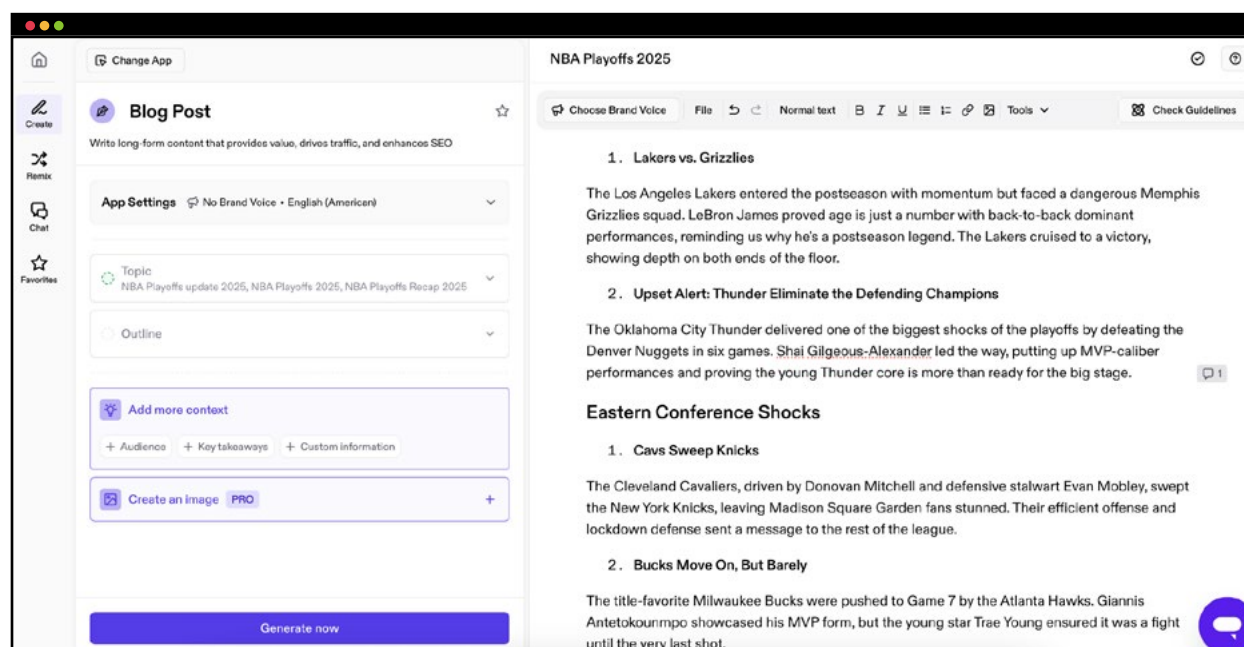
Title tag: 2025 NBA Playoffs: The Road to the Championship

Meta description: Get ready for the 2025 NBA Playoffs! Follow the thrilling journey of the top teams as they battle for the championship title. Stay updated with game highlights, player performances, and key moments leading to the ultimate victory.

The title is solid, making it clear what years’ playoffs the article covers, but it doesn’t make it clear that the playoffs are ongoing, and that this is just a recap of what’s happened to this point, the way Semrush’s title did.

In addition, the meta description is particularly long and will almost certainly be cut off if not entirely rewritten by Google. While that’s not necessarily “bad SEO,” it’s important to quickly provide users the answers they need, and an efficient meta description can make it clear what your content is covering to increase CTR.

Jasper AI



Jasper **doesn't do a great job of logically structuring the content of the article**, definitely not as well as Writer AI did.

If I were searching for a recap of the NBA playoffs, I would want to find an article that tells me the current state of the playoffs right at the top. I would want to know right away who's still playing and when.

Jasper structures its content chronologically, starting with the earliest games and culminating with the Finals, before diving into other storylines. While this does make sense chronologically, it doesn't make as much sense from a user perspective, as it buries its most important information.

That said, the titles and headers themselves are solid and make it clear what each section and subsection will cover, even using unique phrasing like: Upset Alert to describe one matchup.

As for the title tag and meta description, this is what Jasper provided.

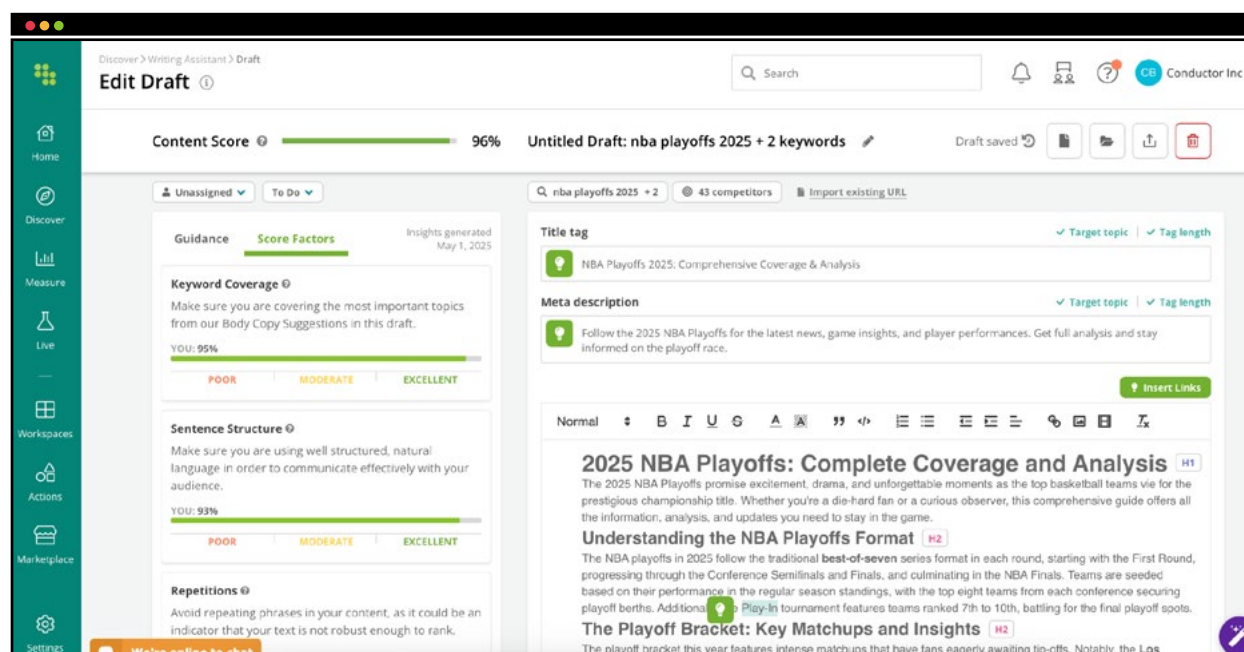
Title tag: NBA Playoffs 2025 Recap & Finals Preview

Meta description: Catch up on all the drama from the 2025 NBA Playoffs, biggest upsets & must-watch Finals matchups between the Lakers vs. Bucks! Full recap + insights here.

Unfortunately, the hallucinations that affected the body copy are impacting the metadata as well. As we established above, the Finals were still weeks away when this output was generated, so Jasper skipped over multiple rounds of the playoffs by including the Finals in the title and meta description.

In addition, the meta description specifically mentions the Lakers vs. the Bucks, but as we know, both of those teams were already eliminated when this was generated.

Conductor



The Conductor output begins with a refresher of the NBA playoffs format, just like Jasper’s did. This is a good inclusion for folks who aren’t familiar with the format or are just more casual fans.

While Jasper’s output dissected each series and matchup chronologically, Conductor dove right into the latest matchups and insights that searchers might want to know. The **headers themselves also make it clear upfront what each section covers**, making it easy for users to skim and find exactly what they need.

The structure does have some faults, though. For example, it has an H2 titled: “**Schedule and Scores: Keeping Up with the Action**”, and the H3 below it titled: **Players to Watch: Top Performers and Rising Stars**. But these two ideas don’t line up well enough to put one in a subsection of the other. Also, from a reader’s perspective, it would make more sense if the output:

1. Established the playoff format.
2. Updated me on the current standings of the playoffs.
3. Explain what players are worth watching.
4. Dive into how to watch those players and teams.

Finally, we have the metadata from Conductor.

Title tag: NBA Playoffs 2025: Comprehensive Coverage & Analysis

Meta description: Follow the 2025 NBA Playoffs for the latest news, game insights, and player performances. Get a full analysis and stay informed on the playoff race.

This metadata again makes it clear, at a glance, exactly what the users will find in this article. However, the title tag could be a bit misleading, as the NBA playoffs coverage isn’t comprehensive since only a portion of it is complete. The meta description, though, is strong and gives a clear, quick overview of the article content that likely won’t be cut off by Google for length.

Final Score: Technical health

Ultimately, Semrush’s output was just too bare bones in terms of structure and headings to really grade this too much higher. While the structure that was there made logical sense, it left out key topics that would have helped to establish expertise and satisfy search intent. From there, the metadata wasn’t strong enough to make up for the lack of topic coverage and intuitive structure.

Meanwhile, Writer AI provided a solid structure with extensive topic coverage, but the headings themselves didn’t always set up the sections well enough to make it clear what each one would cover. For example, one of their H3s was **“Impact on Seeding.”** However, the remaining content didn’t really make it clear what was impacting seeding and what value this section added.

Jasper AI had almost the opposite issue from Writer, as Jasper’s structure needed some improvement, but the language for the headers it generated was strong, and made it clear exactly what each section covers. Jasper’s metadata did suffer from hallucinations, though, unlike any of the other models.

Finally, Conductor’s structure wasn’t as intuitive as it could have been, as it grouped information that didn’t quite match up. However, in terms of language, the headers, meta descriptions, and title tags are all fairly strong, making it clear at a quick glance what the content is covering.

Data output winner: Writer AI

While Conductor was too generous with its content score, its output better satisfied audience search intent, anticipating their needs with people also ask questions and more accurate information.

Security

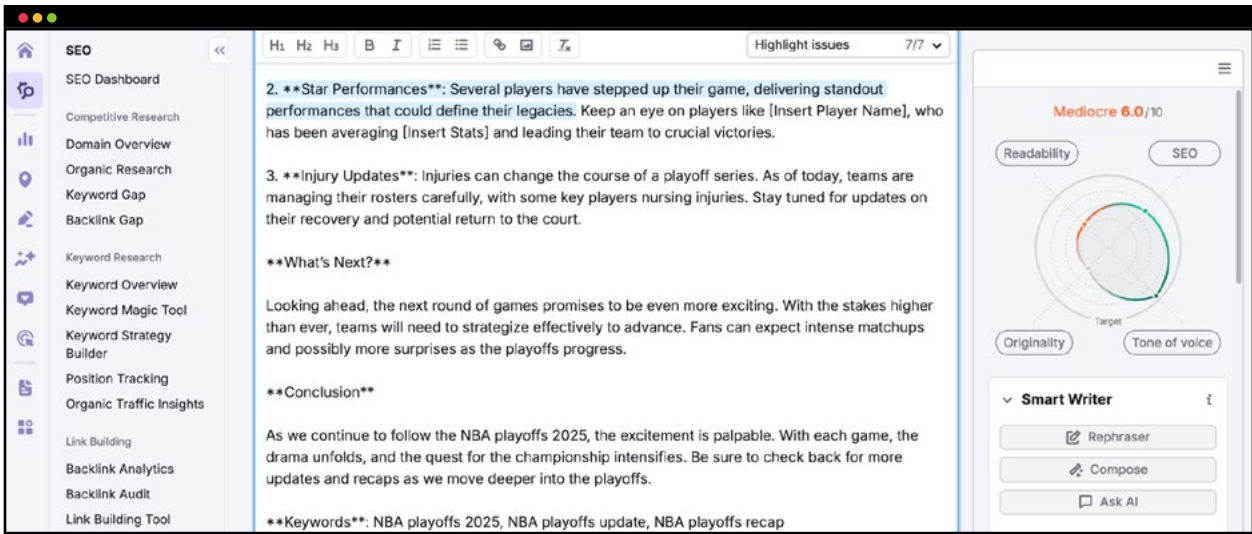
The final pillar category used to evaluate each output is security. Essentially, this is asking how secure you can feel in leveraging or publishing content generated by these AI writing assistants, and, if applicable, how secure you can feel in uploading your own internal content to the AI model.

Specifically, keep these questions in mind as we go through this section.

- **Hallucinations:** Does the output include incorrect or fabricated information or statistics?
- **Plagiarism:** Does the output contain basic or generic language that could have been pulled word-for-word from existing sources?

We didn't grade the AI writing assistants based on model training because this report is geared towards evaluating the output alone, but it is another important aspect of security to keep in mind. Some AI models will leverage your internal data to train their models unless you have a specific enterprise license or agreement with your AI writing assistant.

Semrush



Hallucinations ③

Does the output include incorrect or fabricated information or statistics?

We discussed this a bit in the section on output specificity, but it applies to security as well. Incorrect or false information can pose a huge risk to your brand in terms of authority and audience trust. So, with this in mind, Semrush’s output didn’t include too many hallucinations, but that is likely because it didn’t provide much information at all.

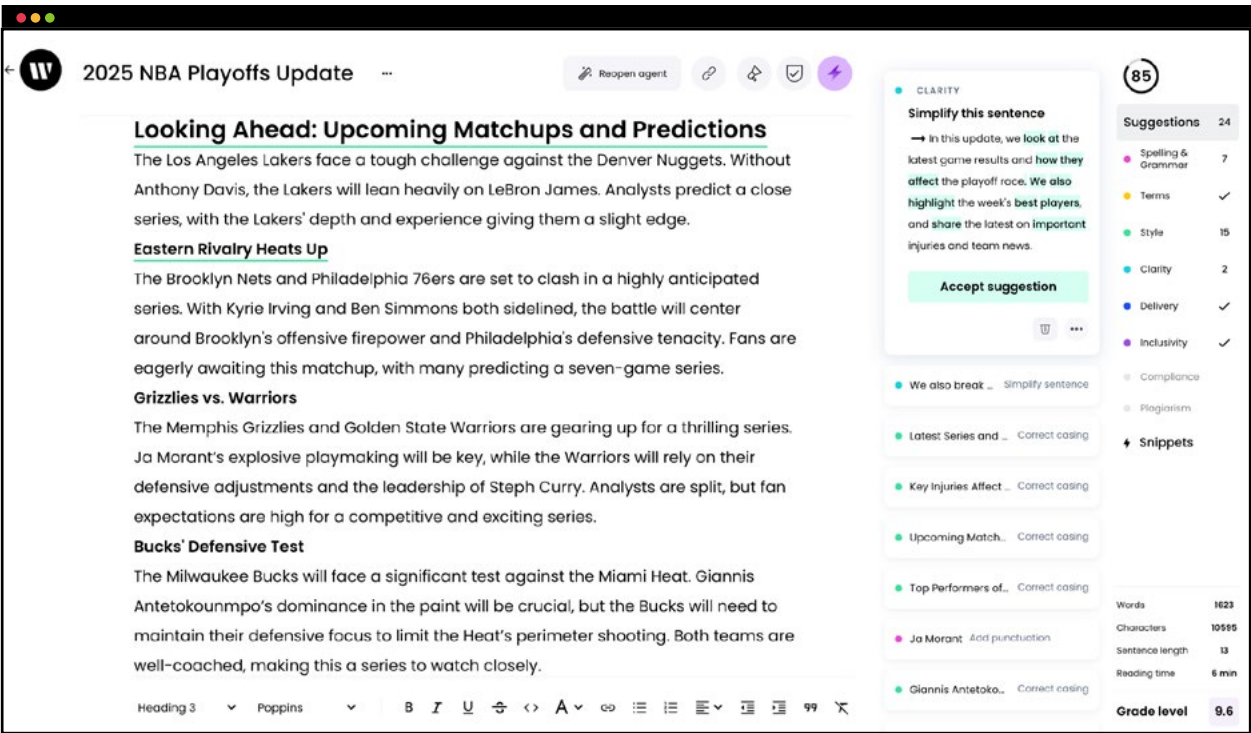
Plagiarism ①

Does the output contain basic or generic language that could have been pulled word-for-word from existing sources?

The more basic, cookie-cutter, or generic the language in a generated output is, the more likely it is that you can find that same language somewhere else online. Whether you consciously plagiarized a site or not, Google can detect plagiarism, and offending sites will lose key authority and audience trust. That’s why generic content can be so risky for your brand.

Does the Semrush output offer particularly unique or specific content? Not really, it doesn’t actually provide a ton of content as it is, and the **copy it did generate is all fairly boilerplate, without many unique characteristics** that are likely to resonate with the reader or establish a voice for the brand.

At this point, we’ve covered that Writer AI generated a lot of hallucinations and fabricated information throughout its output.

From incorrect matchups to improper seeding, to mentioning teams that didn’t make the playoffs, and players who no longer play for those teams, Writer provided misinformation in nearly every section of the article.

That means you would **need to do extensive research and rewrites to resolve all of the issues** before publishing, or risk a huge hit to your brand reputation.

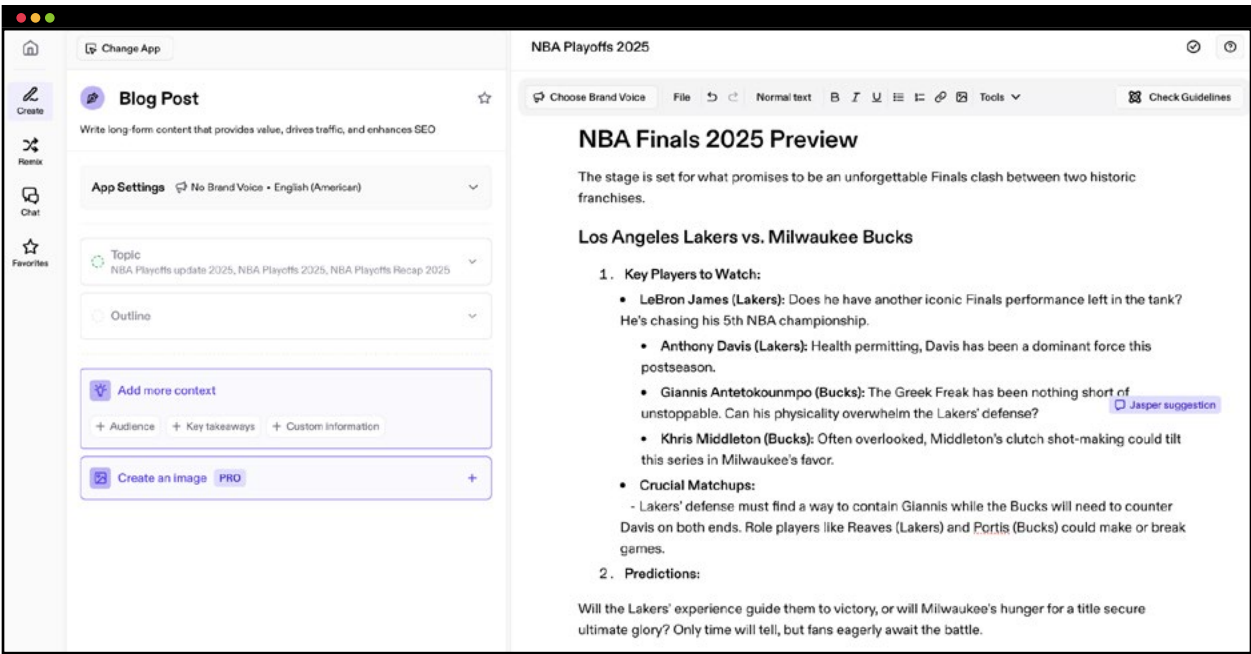

Does the output contain basic or generic language that could have been pulled word-for-word from existing sources?

Granted, with sports content, one article can start to sound a lot like another, since each article largely talks about the same things. However, Writer tends to do a fairly good job of making the copy sound a bit more unique than Semrush did.

While there are some sections and sentences that are very generic, the rest of the article is **differentiated and unique enough that it doesn’t pose as much of a plagiarism risk**. That said, it may not pose much of a plagiarism risk because almost all of the content is incorrect in some way.

Jasper’s output not only provided incorrect information about matchups and playoff seeding, but it also described series that haven’t taken place, teams that have already been eliminated, and even declared who will be playing in the 2025 NBA Finals weeks before the matchup is set.

Again, much of this content is outdated, at best, so if you were to publish this on a sports website, you would be sacrificing your authority and credibility to your readers and search platforms.

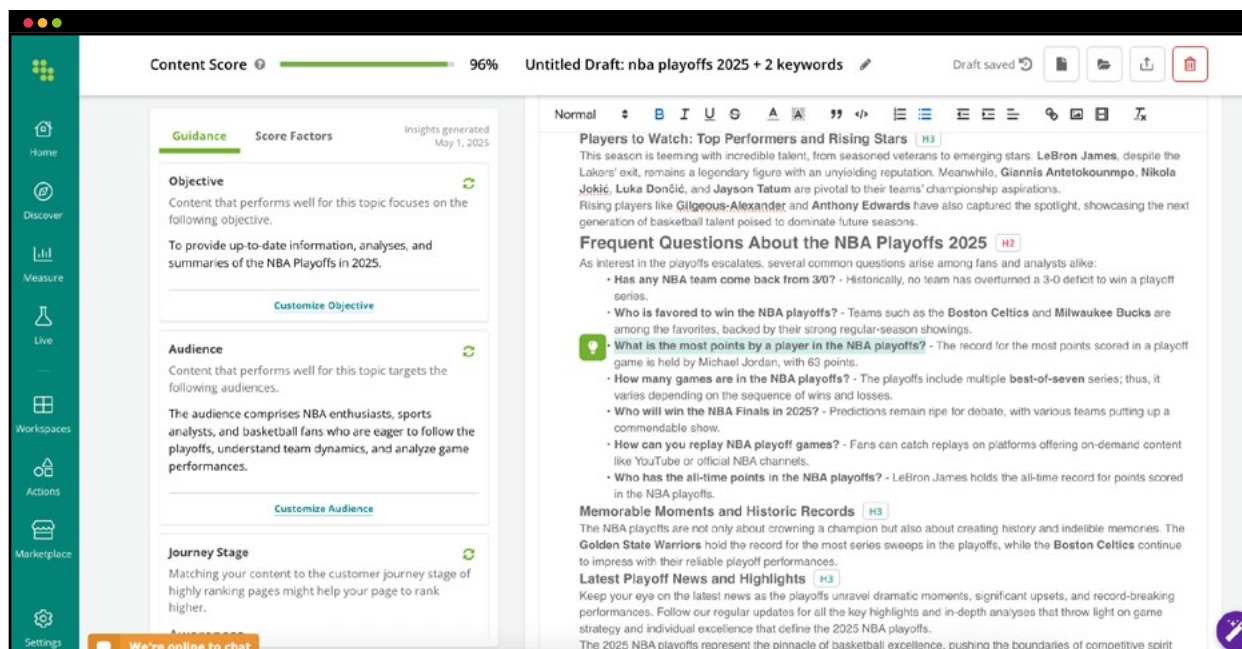
Does the output contain basic or generic language that could have been pulled word-for-word from existing sources?

Jasper’s content generally isn’t generic or basic. However, it does still open up risks of plagiarism.

Specifically, in one paragraph, Jasper generates copy that states: “If one thing remains certain, it’s that these playoffs have further solidified basketball as ‘the theatre of the unexpected.’”

I didn’t provide the “theatre of the unexpected” quote in my prompt, so I googled where it came from. According to Google, that phrase is most closely associated with boxing, not basketball. **The quote also wasn’t properly cited within the output**, so not only does the quote not apply, but it has been pulled into the copy without a source citation, leaving you open to plagiarism risks.

Does the output include incorrect or fabricated information or statistics?

Like all the others, yes, Conductor's output also includes some incorrect and fabricated information. We mentioned earlier that it erroneously had the Warriors playing the Thunder and the Heat playing the Grizzlies, but beyond that, **most of the information is accurate**. There are even some instances where the information is not only accurate, but specific as well, like when it calls out the Lakers' "gripping" series against the Timberwolves that forced a fifth game.

Even the FAQs are answered with correct information, like LeBron James holding the playoff record for points. Any content team will still need to revise the article in places to remove those hallucinations, but it will overall be a much lighter lift than the other models.

Plagiarism ④

Does the output contain basic or generic language that could have been pulled word-for-word from existing sources?

The Conductor output definitely has some basic and generic language throughout it, but sort of in the same way that Writer AI did. It had some cookie-cutter sounding content, but some of that is due to the fact that many sports articles can start to sound alike. In general, the **Conductor output pulls in enough unique data and information** to keep sections feeling fresh, if a bit short.

Final Score: Security

Let’s see how all of these writing assistants did in terms of security.

While Semrush’s output had the fewest hallucinations, it also had the least specific and fleshed-out content to begin with. That generic language makes it more likely that some of the content can be flagged for plagiarism on SERPs, whether the similarities were intentional or not.

Writer AI and Jasper’s outputs were both rife with hallucinations and misinformation that will require a huge lift by the content team to revise and optimize. Frankly, there are so many pieces of incorrect information that actually slowed down the content creation process, meaning you likely would have been more efficient writing it yourself.

While Writer AI did better with plagiarism, for the most part, it leveraged unique yet ultimately incorrect sentences. Jasper, though, pulled in quotes that didn’t apply to the topic we were discussing, and then didn’t properly cite that quote, opening up plagiarism risks.

Conductor’s output had more hallucinations than Semrush, but also it provided much deeper and more specific content than Semrush could provide, so it won’t be as much of a lift to optimize Conductor’s output to remove those hallucinations. At the same time, the copy itself felt unique and fresh enough that a content team shouldn’t need to spend too much time researching to make sure nothing was pulled wholesale from another source.

Data output winner: **Conductor**

Conductor and Semrush stood out for the few hallucinations they displayed compared to the competition. However, Conductor’s content sounded unique, reducing the risk of plagiarism that some of the other tools exhibited.

Conductor's AI Writing Assistant output edged out the competition due to its specificity, topic coverage, and general lack of hallucinations.

Frankly, it's hard to look past the sheer number of hallucinations that Jasper AI and Writer AI generated, and many of the hallucinations could have been disproven with a quick Google search. The sheer volume of them, despite the strong structure both outputs showed, means that brands will either need to perform a huge lift to optimize the output before publishing, or risk their brand reputation and authority in search.

As for Semrush, its output just didn't offer the kind of fleshed-out structure and specific content that readers are looking for when they search on Google or AI answer engines. It didn't have many hallucinations, but it also didn't provide much content in the first place.

That left the door open for Conductor, which provided a generally clear structure, as well as some correct and highly fresh insights, despite a couple of hallucinations.

Also, quick honorable mention for our runner-up in this evaluation, Writer AI. Writer's output suffered from many hallucinations, which limited its grading potential. Despite those inaccuracies, Writer was able to provide unique content in a well-structured way.

In short, none of these outputs were perfect, and all need a review from a human content team before publishing, but from this experiment, we think it's clear that Conductor's output provides the strongest content base to work from.
